Extending my heartfelt greetings on the occasion of Kali Puja and wishing you'll a very Happy Diwali!!



OUR PROJECTS EXECUTED DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2022 ROTA VISION ON 3RD SEPTEMBER

We in association with Rotary International 3291 District and Rotary Club of Ballygunge had conducted Rota Vision, which dealt in free eye check-ups. We catered to about 177 beneficiaries; some of them were diagnosed with cataract. Around 120 people would be given spectacles from Rotary. The event was graced by the Councillor Dilip Bose and Ballygunge Thana OC Mr. Lakshmi Narayan Paan. The event was conducted with support from Naresh Mitra Sarani Bhai Bhai Sarani. We extend our gratitude to all Rotarians present for the event and the Rotaractors for being there and managing the registration, photography and handing the patients.







DISTRIBUTION OF BOOKS AND STATIONERY TO PAEDIATRIC CANCER SURVIVOR

On 7th September we had our first collaboration with the World Paediatric Cancer Department at the Institute of Child Health (ICH). PEHCHAAN- COMPUTER TRAINING CENTRES INSTALLATION

Our club had launched a computer training unit, and installed 3 computers at RCC Rihad, Canning area on 11th September on account of Literacy Week. The beneficiaries would include men, women and children of the area. Pehchaan, is a project initiated to set up free computer training centres in Rural Bengal. It was undertaken under the Ee..Zz..eE School projects launched by our District. The areas of focus included Basic Education, Literacy and Skill Training.







ADULT LITERACY COURSE COMPLETION CERTIFICATE

On account of Literacy Week we had distributed certificates to women who had enrolled for a 6months basic adult literacy program that was initiated last year. This initiative was taken to educate, empower and enable them to achieve more with confidence. The Areas of Focus included Adult Literacy and Women Empowerment. Each woman had presented a short speech in English which truly gave us a feeling of satisfaction and pride.

















UDAAN CERTIFICATE FOR SEWING CLASSES

On account of Literacy week RC of Kolkata Benevolence had given away certificates on completion of basic level course to the students of Udaan, our sewing unit project. The prime areas of focus included, Women Empowerment, Skill Training, Community and Economic Development. It was a government affiliated certificate of NBCE Skill Development, which was received by the candidates after appearing for a theory and practical exam.







SWAROZGAAR-FOOD PROCESSING TRAINING

Our club, RC of Kolkata Benevolence had initiated the Food Processing for the women of Canning area. This would eventually help them to start their own business, and add to the income flow and enhance livelihood. The areas of focus included women empowerment, skill training, community and economic development project. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to GBS for supporting our project.


DANDIYA NIGHT
